## PLEASE READ THIS NOTICE AND RETAIN FOR YOUR RECORDS FACTS ABOUT UFCW LOCAL 655

As a new employee you are represented by UFCW Local 655. This may be your first experience with union representation and you may have questions as to what this means to you. Local 655 was established in 1934 and today has approximately 15,000 members working in various industries for multiple employers. The Local is part of a larger International Union representing workers throughout the United States and Canada. The UFCW International Union represents approximately 1.5 million total members. There are approximately 500 local

unions that make up the International. UFCW is proud to be one of the largest International Unions in the United States.

The International and Local Unions are governed by a written Constitution and Bylaws. We are a democratic institution governed by our members. A copy of the Constitution and Bylaws are available to members of the union upon your request.

On your behalf, Local 655 negotiates and enforces a Collective Bargaining Agreement that contains your wages, benefits, hours, and all other working conditions. As a result of negotiation through the union, members receive higher wages and better benefits than non-union workers doing similar jobs. Strength in numbers makes this possible.

The officers of Local 655 consist of the president, secretary-treasurer, recorder and the vice-presidents that comprise the Executive Board. Your Collective Bargaining Agreement is administered by a Union Representative. You may also have a shop steward at your place of work. Should you have any questions or problems, you should contact one of them or the union office. The local Union officers are elected by the membership in secret ballot elections. As a member, you will be able to participate and vote in these elections.

Welcome to UFCW Local 655. It is a pleasure to have you as a member of this Local Union. You should contact us if we may help you in any way. We look forward to serving you.

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR NEW HIRES

The collective bargaining agreement with your employer provides that you must become a member in good standing in UFCW Local 655. This means only the timely tender by you of the uniform initiation fees and periodic dues as may be lawfully required. While you do not have to become a full member of Local 655, membership in the Local provides you with very important rights in addition to the wages, benefits and job security provided by the collective bargaining agreement. These rights include the right to:

VOTE to accept or reject a proposed Collective Bargaining Agreement:

FULLY PARTICIPATE in the development of contract proposals;

VOTE in the election of your union officers:

BENEFIT from other programs such as credit cards, discount coupons, and other services available only to union members. These rights and others are clearly set forth in the Union Constitution. Please take time to read it carefully.

If you choose to forego the above rights and not be a full member of Local 655, you may file a written objection to funding union expenditures that are not germane to the union's role as a collective bargaining representative. Individuals desiring to file an objection should notify the Local 655 Fee Administrator in writing and request a description of the further procedures which must be followed and to obtain further information as to how these fees are calculated. For the year ending December 31, 1993, approximately 86 percent of Local 655s expenditures were germane to collective bargaining activities, You may contact the Local Fe Administrator at the Union office located at 300 Weidman Road, Ballwin, Missouri 63011.
