'Right to Work' Update

A So-Called 'Right to Work' Law was rammed through the Missouri General Assembly during the closing week of the Legislative Session last month.

Make no mistake, this law is designed to drive down the wages of Missouri's workers by crippling our ability to join together and build power.

In the coming weeks Governor Nixon is expected to veto this harmful piece of legislation, none-theless, he needs to hear from YOU:

"There are many causes of growing income inequality—globalization, education disparities, tax policy—but an International Monetary Fund study released in March found that the decline in union membership has been responsible for half of the rise in the share of income going to the top 10 percent of earners in advanced economies between 1980 and 2010. Declining union membership, by weakening the bargaining power of low and middle-income workers at both union and nonunion businesses, has increased the share of wealth going to corporate higher-ups and shareholders"


